## SUCCINEA SUSHUPTA, NOM. MUT.—A CORRECTION.

In 1925¹ I described a curious little aestivating Succineid mollusc from the Western Ghats near Lonavla (Bombay Presidency) under the name Succinea arboricola. While going through the current literature received in the library of the Zoological Survey of India, I discovered that the specific name arboricola is preoccupied in the genus for a South African species described by Mousson as S. arborea and renamed by Connolly as S. arboricola on grounds of priority [vide Connolly, M. in Ann. S. African Mus. XI, p. 220 (1912) and in XXXIII, p. 446 (1939) of the same journal]. I, therefore, propose the new name sushupta² for the Western Ghats species.
